Bernalillo High School was opened in the fall of 1949. It was a school built in response to the "Dixon" case which took Catholic nuns out of teaching in public schools. Prior to the opening of Bernalillo High School a public school did operate in the town of Bernalillo. It was at the Our Lady of Sorrows location and many of the teachers were nuns and brothers of the Catholic Church. The school was called "Bernalillo High School" from 1931 to 1949. When the new Bernalillo High School was built, the old school continued operations for several years as "Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic School."

The school before 1949, was called Bernalillo, and used nicknames such as "Eagles" in the 1930's. The name "Mustangs" first appeared in the 1940's and continued to be the mascot of OLOS after the split. The OLOS colors were blue and gold.

For historical purposes, I have included all of "Bernalillo's" records prior to 1950, as part of OLOS. When the new school was built in the fall of 1949, there was a new nickname (Spartans) and the school colors of cherry and grey was adopted.
